Amazing as it is to imagine that dolphins and other cetaceans could soon be entitled to their own rights. Mythology tells us that these creatures enjoyed a will of their own. CAMOUFLAGE COLOURING:

Almost every plant and animal in the world has enemies that threaten existence. So to protect itself from predators, every living being has developed some defence mechanism. Sensing the danger, some organism hide, others run, while some just fly away.

Some organism can even hide without moving. They use 'camouflage colouring'. That means that their skin colour blends in with the matching colour of the surrounding areas so well that the enemies cannot see them. Chameleon has the capacity of changing its body colours. If it is on a geen leaf, it turns green; if on a brown twig, it turns brown. Some rabbits change colour with the season. The snow-shoe hare is brown in summer and white in winter. The white fur camouflage the rabbits in the snow.

Another phenomenon called counter shading is common type of camouflage among the fishes. The underside of their body is of lighter shade than the top. This helps the fish to blend in with many shadows it might make. Some other animals have remarkable ability to take the form and colour of some other object around them. Camouflage also helps among animals catch their food. Since they can blend in with their surroundings, their victims can't spot them immediately and others get caught.

Many non-poisonous snakes have colours similar to poisonous snakes. Enemies think that the snake is poisonous and thus refrain from attacking. Thie type of defence mechanism is calld mimicry. Some poisonous snakes have a bright colour to warn off enemies that are nearby. This is called warning colouration.

Close your eyes. Imagine the vast blue ocean and think of your favourite sea creature. Did you see the face of cute bottle-nosed dolphin with a wide grin spread across his face? Fun-loving, gentle and sensitive, the dolphin is an amazing mammal said to possess unusually high intelligence. Recent research suggests that the mammals' squeaks and clicks may be a form of communication and that some signature whistles could also be ways for the dolphin to identify itself and call out to each other. What does this mean? It implies that dolphins, much like humans, name each other and call out to each other using these names!

Dolphins are truly out of the ordinary because of their intelligence. And, among the many creatures that share the earth with us, they come closest to humankind in terms of familial traits, emotions and learning. Just like us, dolphins live in groups called pods that they consider family. The feeling of community within a pod is intense. The dolphins in a pod care for the sick, elderly or injured and grieve just like humans. Like us, they are also social mammals who enjoy the company of dolphins from other pods, and sometimes even tease the sea creatures in their vicinity. Dolphins nurse their babies like humans and young ones remain with their mothers for almost three years, before swimming off to start their own family.

Amazing as it is to imagine that dolphins and other cetaceans could soon be entitled to their own rights. Mythology tells us that these creatures enjoyed a will of their own. The dolphin is depicted in many Greek stories as a seafaring creature that guided ships and helped sailors on long, treacherous journeys. According to one particular Greek myth, dolphins have "human" qualities because they were once humans themselves. The story goes that the Grreek God Dionysus was travelling the oceans when he was captured by pirates who mistook him for a royal member. The pirates chained the God to the ship's mast and rowed towards Turkey dreaming of rich ransom. Unobserved Dionysus broke out of his chains and started playing his flute.

As he played his song, grape vines entwined the ships' mast and the oars turned into serpents. Frightened, the pirates threw themselves overboard and started to drown. However, Dionysus took pity on them and turned them into dolphins, blessing them with the ability to help and guide other seafarers in the future.
